Action for Children (Chicago)	Developmental Screening	\$100,000	1 year	<i>Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Model</i>	Funding was provided to continue a model of consultation with child care providers serving children throughout Cook County, designed to ensure that children ages birth through 6 who are at risk of social-emotional and behavioral problems are healthy and ready to succeed in school.
Advocate Charitable Foundation (Park Ridge)	Developmental Screening	\$139,787	1 year	<i>Enhancing Developmentally - Oriented Primary Care (EDOPC)</i>	Funding was provided to continue a program of assisting primary care practices throughout the state in implementing tools designed to screen children for developmental issues, screen their mothers for post-partum depression, understand how and to whom referrals should be made, and to educate parents on their children's healthy development.
Alivio Medical Center (Chicago)	General Pediatrics	\$215,105	1 year	<i>Little Village Needs a School-Based Health Clinic</i>	Funding was provided to complete the build-out of a school-based health center to be located at the John Spry Elementary School in the Little Village community on Chicago's southwest side. Dollars will cover the costs for construction and equipment required for the new clinic.
Aunt Martha's Youth Service Center (Chicago Heights)	Oral Health & Behavioral/ Mental Health	\$227,431	1 year	<i>Dental and Behavioral Health Services</i>	Funding was provided for construction and equipment costs required to establish specialized dental and behavioral health services for Thornton Fractional High School students and families through a new school-linked health center in Calumet City.

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Cass County (Virginia)	General Pediatrics & Oral Health	\$154,000	1 year	<i>School-Linked Health Center</i>	Funding was provided to assist with the construction of new exam rooms for medical and dental services to be located in the public health department in Virginia, and for the contracted services of a dentist and dental hygienist.

Children's Hospital of Illinois (Peoria)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$350,000	1 year	<i>Treating Childhood Depression: A Community Collaborative Approach (Resource Link)</i>	Funding was provided to continue a pilot program that offers comprehensive assessment/short-term treatment of children for mental health issues, consultation to pediatricians and other primary care providers regarding appropriate diagnosis and treatment, and education and training of healthcare professionals.
Children's Memorial Hospital (Chicago)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$237,750	1 year	<i>Incorporating Mental Health Services into the Care of Vulnerable Children, Teens and Families: A Coordinated Approach Between Primary Care Medical Home and the Community it Serves</i>	Funding was provided for the construction and staffing required to expand mental health evaluation, treatment and follow-up care among high-risk children, adolescents and young adults by incorporating new/expanded services into a pediatric primary care community health center in Chicago's Uptown neighborhood.

(Christopher)	Oral Health	\$200,000	1 year	<i>Zeigler Community Health Center</i>	Funding was provided for the dental equipment and the construction of three new dental operatories, and to hire a dentist who will serve the oral health needs of children throughout Franklin County.
Coles County Mental Health Association (Mattoon)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$326,516	1 year	<i>HF2: Healthy Families, Healthy Futures Children's Evaluation and Treatment Center</i>	Funding was provided for a portion of the construction costs and staffing required to establish a regional treatment and evaluation center that will work with primary care providers and schools to serve the mental health needs of children throughout Coles, Edgar and Clark counties in Southern Illinois.
Community Health & Emergency Services, Inc.	Oral Health	\$215,000	Over 2 years	<i>Access to Oral Surgeries for Illinois Children</i>	Funding was provided for a portion of the costs associated with hiring an oral surgeon, and for related staff, equipment, and communications expenses. The grant is being awarded in two installments - one in late 2006 to help with upfront costs, and the second in mid-2007 once the oral surgeon is hired and begins work.

Community Health Improvement Council of Decatur III (Decatur)	General Pediatrics	\$200,000	1 year	<i>Enhancement and Expansion of Primary Care Medical Services to the Low-Income Pediatric Population of Champaign County</i>	Funding was provided to support the staffing, equipment and construction costs associated with the expansion of pediatric services at a community health center serving children from Macon and Champaign counties.
Community Health Partnership of Illinois (Chicago)	General Pediatrics	\$256,942	1 year	<i>Hogar de Salud del Nino</i>	Funding was provided for the construction, staffing and a portion of the equipment required to establish a pediatric medical/dental area in a new migrant health clinic that is relocating from Momence to Kankakee.

Hope School (Springfield)	Developmental Screening	\$100,000	1 year	<i>Serving Children with Developmental Disabilities and Autism Spectrum Disorders: Improving Pediatric Care Access and Quality in Illinois (IMPAQ)</i>	Funding was provided to continue a program designed to develop and strengthen coordinated care for children with developmental disabilities and autism spectrum disorders. Dollars awarded will cover the cost of providing medical and specialty care, workforce development through telehealth education, and program evaluation.

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LaRabida Children's Hospital (Chicago)	Developmental Screening	\$70,000	1 year	<i>Premier Kids</i>	Funding was provided to continue a program created that identifies at-risk children born prematurely in area hospitals and follows them through their first five years, providing a medical home that will work to improve their physical and developmental outcomes. Dollars awarded will support general operating costs for the program.
Loyola University Medical Center (Maywood)	Developmental Screening	\$138,765	1 year	<i>The Loyola Center for Child Development</i>	Funding was provided for the staffing costs associated with establishing an integrated developmental/behavioral screening protocol to be implemented in nine primary care community-based clinics of the Loyola University Healthcare system.
Macoupin County Public Health Department (Carlinville)	General Pediatrics	\$213,425	1 year	<i>Expanding Primary Care, Counseling Services and Oral Health, and Implementing Psychiatric Care and Support Services through the School-Linked Health Center</i>	Funding was provided to expand oral health and general pediatric services provided to area children through a dental clinic and school-linked health center operated by the health department. Additionally, dollars were awarded to establish psychiatric/behavioral health services at the school-linked health center. The grant will support the costs of staffing required for the expanded and new services.
Ounce of Prevention Fund (Chicago)	Developmental Screening	\$100,000	1 year	<i>Expanding Developmental Screening and Referral Project</i>	Funding was provided to continue a targeted effort to promote a coordinated system of screening and referral of young children for early intervention and mental health services. Dollars awarded will support general operating costs for the program.

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PCC Community Wellness Center (Oak Park)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$260,329	1 year	<i>Transitions for Wellness</i>	Funding was provided for a collaborative project that integrates children's behavioral health services into primary care settings, includes a Parenting Support program and community outreach. Dollars awarded will cover a portion of the costs required to establish a service delivery site, staffing, operations and evaluation.
Rush University Medical Center (Chicago)	General Pediatrics	\$50,390	1 year	<i>Mother's Milk Club</i>	Funding was provided to continue the implementation and expansion of a program designed to assist the mothers of very low birth weight babies begin and continue breastfeeding. Dollars awarded will support general operating costs for the program, including a three-year evaluation.
Sarah Bush Lincoln Health Center (Lincoln)	Oral Health	\$50,000	1 year	<i>Women & Children FIRST Dental Program and School-Based Outreach Project</i>	Funding was provided to cover the costs of expanding oral health services currently being offered through a community collaborative and to develop a new school-based program, and include staffing, portable dental equipment, contracted dental professionals, and travel throughout a six-county area in southeastern Illinois.
Shawnee Health Service and Development Corp. (Carterville)	General Pediatrics & Mental/Behavioral Health	\$204,863	1 year	<i>Expansion of General Pediatrics and Addition of Behavioral Health Services at the School-Based Health Center</i>	Funding was provided to expand general pediatric health services provided to area children through two school-based health centers. Dollars awarded will also cover the costs of physically expanding one health center located at Carbondale High School and to add mental/behavioral health services to both centers, including construction and equipment.
Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation (East St. Louis)	Oral Health	\$113,500	1 year	<i>Expansion of Oral Health Services in Bethalto to Serve the Region</i>	Funding was provided for an expansion of the dental services currently being offered to children through their community health center located in northern Madison County. Costs covered by the grant include remodeling, equipment, and staffing required to add three new dental operatories to the clinic.

Dollars awarded will cover the costs of infant mental health professionals who will provide intensive training to/consultation with mental health center staff to better identify and address the mental health needs of their youngest clients.
Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (Springfield)	General Pediatrics	\$125,000	1 year	<i>Healthy Births for Healthy Communities</i>	Funding was provided for the start-up phase of a four-year pilot program that seeks to improve birth outcomes for the mothers in two Chicago communities (Austin, North Lawndale) experiencing the highest rates of low birth weight babies and infant mortality in the state.

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Illinois Rural Health Association (Springfield)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$5,000	1 year	<i>Access to Mental Health Care in Rural Illinois: Moving from Crisis to Action</i>	Funding was provided for partial support of the costs associated with holding a one-day conference in October, 2006, that would bring rural health experts together to identify opportunities to improve the access rural residents have to mental health services.
Illinois State University (Normal)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$51,920	1 year	<i>Illinois School Psychology Internship Consortium</i>	Funding was provided to expand a program that places school psychology students from four Illinois universities into internships in high-need school districts and works to place them in underserved areas after graduation.
Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (Chicago)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$50,000	1 year	<i>Safe From the Start</i>	Funding was provided to develop a training manual and formalize training processes for Safe from the Start, a statewide intervention program for children who have been exposed to violence.
