Adams County Health Department (Quincy)	Oral Health	\$208,638	1 year	<i>Expanding Oral Health Services for Children</i>	Funding was provided for the recruitment and hiring of a dentist, dental assistants, and equipment related to the expansion of the County's orthodontic program.
Alivio Medical Center (Chicago)	Oral Health	\$294,793	1 year	<i>Children's Oral Health Expansion Project</i>	Funding was provided for the integration and expansion of two oral health programs including a dental clinic in Little Village and a dental education program being conducted in 18 area schools. Dollars will support new staff and training expenses.
Aunt Martha's Youth Service Center (Chicago Heights)	Oral Health	\$100,000	1 year	<i>Mobile Oral Health Program</i>	Funding was provided to expand access to oral health through the use of a mobile health unit that will serve patients in the organization's Kankakee and Chicago Heights clinics. Dollars will be used for staffing, operations and marketing-related costs.

(Springfield)	Oral Health	\$202,412	1 year	<i>Augmenting the Children's Oral Health Access Foundation in Central Illinois</i>	Funding was provided to equip three additional dental operatories and add staff required to serve new pediatric patients in the organization's Springfield health clinic.

Dollars will be used for staffing, equipment, and office operating expenses for the establishment of the new services.

(Chicago)	Oral Health	\$102,000	1 year	<i>Oral Health Staffing Expansion</i>	Funding was provided to expand oral health services through the addition three new dental operatories in the organization's South Chicago clinic. Dollars will also provide for new staff required for the expansion.

(Davenport, IA)	Oral Health	\$126,336	1 year	<i>Expanding Pediatric Dental Care</i>	Funding was provided to add new staff to a community health center in Rock Island, including a dental hygienist, dental assistants and a patient service professional. Dollars will also provide for the development of new patient education materials.

Dollars will cover costs associated with space renovation, new equipment and furniture, and the staff required to provide the new dental services.

Dollars will be used to add a pediatric dentist and dental assistants to the staff, support office operations and allow for the marketing of the expanded services.
DeWitt/Piatt Bi-County Health Department (Monticello)	Oral Health	\$160,000	1 year	<i>DeWitt/Piatt Bi-County Health Dept. Dental Clinic</i>	Funding was provided for a portion of the construction cost related to the development of a new dental clinic that will have three operatories.
Franklin-Williamson Human Services, Inc. and Affiliates (West Frankfort)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$110,000	1 year	<i>Solutions for Youth</i>	Funding was provided to expand the mental health services currently provided to four school districts in Williamson County. Dollars will be primarily used for construction and equipment necessary to complete the project.

Dollars will be used primarily for staffing, equipment and operating costs for the expanded services.
Kane County Health Department (Aurora)	Oral Health	\$177,472	1 year	<i>KCHAIN Program: Oral Health Awareness and Health Access Project</i>	Funding was provided for the purchase and staffing of a mobile health van that will travel to local schools and community settings to conduct oral health screenings, deliver preventive services, education and provide a linkage to a medical/dental home for children in Kane County.
Knox County Health Department (Galesburg)	Oral Health	\$300,000	1 year	<i>Dental Clinic Access Expansion Project for Low-Income and Medicaid Children</i>	Funding was provided for the expansion of the health department's dental clinic. Dollars will be used to for the construction and equipment required to add three new operatories.
McHenry County Health Department (Woodstock)	Oral Health	\$255,000	1 year	<i>Dental Clinic Expansion Project</i>	Funding was provided for new staff, equipment and supplies required to expand the health department's dental clinic operations from three days per week to five days per week.

Dollars will be used for the recruitment, staffing and new equipment required to expand operations.
Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation (East St. Louis)	Oral Health	\$127,416	1 year	<i>Expanding Dental Services in Granite City</i>	Funding was provided to expand the capacity of the organization's community health center in Granite City through the addition of new dental staff and necessary dental equipment.

Drake School and the Mile Square Community Health Center. Dollars will be used primarily for new staff for the program.
Whiteside County Community Health Clinic, Inc. (Rock Falls)	Oral Health	\$75,000	1 year	<i>Children's Dental Program: Linking Children with Dental Needs to a Medical/Dental Home</i>	Funding was provided for the expansion of the organization's dental program to schools through the use of portable dental equipment. Dollars will cover a portion of the staffing and equipment costs related to the new program.

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Youth Guidance (Chicago)	Mental/Behavioral Health	\$200,000	1 year	<i>Yo Puedo/I Can</i>	Funding was provided to expand existing mental health services to high school students attending Roberte Clemente Community Academy, through the Wildcats Student Health Center.
